RELEGATION FINAL

A relegation final is dubious label to today's clash. Let's be honest it's the game that each of the 12 teams in the senior championship never envisaged playing in.

At the start of the championship everything was possible but three games and three defeats later both Dunhill and Tallow find themselves facing the trapdoor. As the saying goes the table doesn't lie and both sides today have struggled to get that all-important championship win.

Dunhill will look back at their preliminary quarter final loss to Abbeyside by the minimum as the one that got away. Dunhill did everything in this game bar win. The placing of their deadly duo Shane Casey and Eamonn Murphy in the inside forward line worked a treat with both players causing major difficulties for the Abbeyside defence. Cillian Bonner who is more and more resembles his famous uncle Cormac 'The Viking' Bonner was hugely influential on the forty that day and a major loss last time out. Dunhill's 'Viking', socks up and all has matured into a combative attacker in his club's colours. Shane Casey and Eamonn Murphy have been stand out performers for Dunhill for a decade or more and both wore the county jersey with distinction particularly at underage where they excelled. Unfortunately for Tom Casey's men they failed to nail a sufficient number of scoring opportunities particularly down the stretch in the Abbeyside game while generous defending was their undoing last time out.

Scoring is something Tallow have also been shy about this year. A paltry 1-11 the last day against a rejuvenated Passage side gives clear indication of their main tale of woe. They registered 0-14 v De La Salle, 0-11 v Mount Sion but a healthier 3-14 when going down narrowly to Abbeyside. Tallow were level at the break to De La Salle but fell out of contention over the second period. As ever Tommy Ryan carries their main attacking threat and indeed hit all bar four points in the defeat to De La Salle. If you were picking a 'Club Championship Team of the Decade' Tommy Ryan would be top of the list on this selection having year in year out being a top performer for his club. Of course Tommy with yellow helmet has looked as splendid in white and blue of Waterford as in blue and gold of Tallow. A great servant for club and county. Needless to say a little more help from his friends could tip the balance in Tallow's favour. Jordan Henley, Ryan Gray and Ian Beecher with veteran defender Mark O'Brien all crucial in deciding today's game.

For the winners promises relief and another season in the top flight. For the defeated they have the consolation of participating next year in the new eagerly awaited 'Premier Intermediate' championship. The four semi-finalists in the divisional Intermediate championships – Erins Own, Ferrybank, Tramore and Ballygunner in the east together with Ballysaggart, Shamrocks, Cappoquin and Clashmore from the west have qualified for the new 'Premier Intermediate' championship to be played on an All-County basis.

All to play for then today. In or out, up or down, drama aplenty is sure to ensue.

BALLYGUNNER V ROANMORE : SUNDAY SEPTEMBER 4TH IN WALSH PARK AT 1.30PM

BALLYGUNNER TWO STEPS AWAY FROM RECORD EQUALING NINE IN A ROW

Hurling fans around the County were happy to see Ballygunner and Mount Sion kept apart in last Sunday's semi final draw after the last of the quarter finals played at the Fraher Field. Ballygunner wouldn't mind who they would draw but Roanmore must have been hoping to be paired with one of the other semi finalists.

The Gunners are showing no signs of tiring despite their year in and year out preparation for their many title wins as they have the players to replace those on earlier successful sides. Roanmore will be hoping to perform better than in last year's County final when their opposition on Sunday defeated them by 2-27 to 0-13.

This is the task that awaits the sky blues on Sunday with another win for the champions the likely outcome.

MOUNT SION V DLS : SUNDAY SEPTEMBER 4TH IN WALSH PARK AT 3-15PM

BOTH CLUBS SEEK COUNTY FINAL RETURN

DLS played the County finals of 2017 and 2019 and the last time Mt. Sion contested the decider was in 2014. This game will probably be the better of the two semis on Sunday and DLS will be hoping that Jack Fagan's red card will be overturned while 'Sion will similarly willing Stephen Roche to be recovered from his injury sustained last week. Both are key players for their respective teams and the loss of either could have a big bearing on the result.

DLS are improving as the championship progresses and they will be confident that they can return to the final for the first time in three years. They had a challenging hour against Dungarvan last week while Mt. Sion haven't had a tough game yet, winning their three outings comfortably against Abbesside, Tallow and Lismore.

One would imagine that this game would have been the curtain raiser but with Ballygunner involved in other championships this weekend, they may be playing first so as to accommodate viewing of other matches by their supporters.

2022 is the first time since 2000 that the four city teams have been the semi finalists with Ballygunner and Mt. Sion contesting the final which Mount Sion won by 1-20 to 0-9. What are the chances of a repeat 22 years later?

WATERFORD SENIOR HURLING CHAMPIONSHIP RELEGATION FINAL

TALLOW V DUNHILL IN FRAHER FIELD : SATURDAY SEPTEMBER 3RD AT 1-30PM

The bottom line here is that neither team has won any of their four championship games to date and whichever side loses in Dungarvan on Sunday will be relegated to the Intermediate Premier championship in 2023.

At the same time, there may be a safety net for the losers because if Ballygunner's second team wins the County Intermediate title, then there will be no relegation from the top tier as a club (Ballygunner) cannot have two teams in the senior championship.

Yet, neither Tallow or Dunhill will want to be sweating on this scenario. From a Western viewpoint there is a real chance that Tallow may lose out here because going on the current form of both sides, Dunhill have been very competitive.

Abbesside defeated Tallow by 2-20 to 3-14 and they overcame Dunhill by 3-13 to 1-18 so there is clearly very little difference in standards between this Saturday's pairing.

Senior hurling in the west is not in a very healthy state at the moment with this Sunday's four semi finalists all from the East so we could well do without losing Tallow from the top tier.
